Canton For All People will receive \$900,000 from the state of Ohio to build nine additional homes. Congratulations is also in order for Habitat For Humanity East Central Ohio for receiving \$900,000.

This funding is part of the \$26.9 million in grants announced by Ohio Governor Mike DeWine and Ohio Department of Development Director Lydia Mihalik to expand access to safe, affordable housing in 57 counties.

The funding comes from the latest round of the Welcome Home Ohio Program, which is designed to provide grants for the purchase of qualifying residential properties, the cost of construction or rehabilitation, or nonrefundable tax credits for qualifying activities.

"We want to figure out a practical sustainable way and build some infrastructure that supports the people who live here in Canton," said Gino Haynes, the deputy director of Canton For All People.

Residents shared about their experience living in the apartments. Canton For All People also received recognition from Gov. Mike DeWine's office. Afterwards, those in attendance were able to tour the property and visit various apartment units.

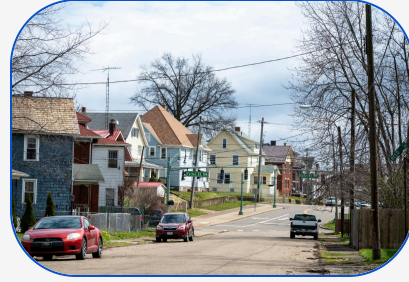

Apply for our Homeowner Improvement Program



Through a \$1.5 million Affordable Housing Program award from the Federal Home Loan Bank of Cincinnati, Canton for All People will complete repairs up to \$15,000 for owner-occupied homes in the City of Canton for eligible residents. [Apply here.](#)

Typical repairs include:

- Roof repairs
- Windows, doors and siding improvements
- Plumbing and emergency water issues
- HVAC replacement
- Electrical repairs
- Accessibility modifications

Eligibility Criteria include:

- Priority for majority minority census tracts
- Homeownership & residency
- Income limits
- Age 60+
- Physically or developmentally disabled
- Repair needs
- Program participation

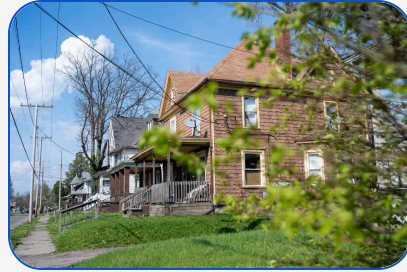
